Key Features


- 40-year concession of 14 Regional Airports

- Ensuring ongoing contribution to treasury




Aircraft Movements

Average Confirmed Strikes






Average Confirmed Strike Rate








Species' strikes/ 10,000 movements at FG airports




Confirmed wildlife strike per flight phase (2018-2020)
